Canada/Egypt Relations: *Cooperation in Action*

Egypt the gateway to the Middle East and Africa:

Egypt and Canada are both key geo-strategic locations in their respective regions. Egypt is the gateway to the Arab world, the Middle East and Africa. Canada is the gateway to North and South America, the Commonwealth and the Eurosphere world. Combined the reach of our two nations spans most of the world.

Egypt a welcoming environment:

Since establishing diplomatic relations fifty years ago, Canada and Egypt have enjoyed a mutually beneficial bilateral relationship characterized by ever increasing levels of partnership and strategic alliances advantageously to both countries.

Canadian companies find in Egypt a welcoming environment that is enhanced by the positive reputation that Canada enjoys in the Middle East. The presence of around 162,000 mainly highly educated Egyptian Canadians who return to invest both their adopted home and that of their origin.

Bilateral trade between Egypt and Canada is growing and increasingly diverse. Canadian exports to Egypt reached unprecedented levels in 2005, when the third quarter of 2005, the figure reached C\$31 million, nearly twice as much as the reported figure 10 years ago.

Major Egypt Exports to Canada are:

Steel, Ferrous, Mineral-based graphite, Copper Blkt, Ceramic, Computer Software, Manufactured chlorine, Corn oil, Fruits and preserved fruits, Specialised precision devices.

The main imports from Canada are:

Technological know how, Specialised tools and machinery, Glass, Saw Beans, Linoleum, Healthcare Software, Specified perfuma, 45% of Canadian tourists visited Egypt in 2004.

Among our international friends, the Canadian remains one of Egypt's strongest and most steadfast supporters. Investment and assistance has continued to flow into Egypt from the Canadian private and public sectors. The Egyptian people have benefited from the presence of Petro-Canada, TELUS, Fortis, Air Canada and other important Canadian companies.

Canadian Education in Egypt: a win-win scenario

The dramatic growth of the Canadian Education industry in Egypt in recent years is evidence of the strengthening of ties between the two countries on social as well as economic levels. Canada gains a new export product and healthy market for educational institutions at home. For both countries, however, there is a win-win scenario that goes beyond economics. Forging strong cultural bonds will for the future of Canada-Egypt relations.

Canadian Aid: a serious partner in development

For over 25 years, Canadian bilateral aid to Egypt has played a key role in solidifying the relationship between the two countries by building the spirit of cooperation.

The Canadian International Development Agency, noted around the world as a wise and generous distributor of development assistance, counts Egypt as its second largest recipient of aid.

What is Egypt?

Egypt is the Great Pyramids of Giza and the Sphinx.

Zahi Hawass, the world's most eminent Egyptologist says "the first thing people need to see in Egypt are the Pyramids because they are magic".

Egypt is the Egyptian Museum

This museum houses a magnificent collection of Ancient Egyptian artefacts, including King Tut's splendid tomb. There is so much to see here you could spend several days exploring this unrivalled treasure of a Museum.



Egypt's recent Economic Reforms: *The story so far*

Egypt today is different. The Country has been engaged in a wide-ranging program of reform, striving for social, economic and political change.

On the economic front Egypt is actively courting foreign investment and paving the way with legislation. These modifications have lead to an increase in private investment and consumption, as well as attracted strong FDI flows, pushing GDP growth to 5.1% in 2004/2005 – the highest level in four years.

The Private sector:

An aggressive privatization program has been introduced. Sectors that were previously restricted have been opened. Today, all agricultural land is in the hands of private owners. 80 percent of all oil and gas services are operated by the private sector, with 90 percent of all exploration activities carried out by multinationals. The government awarded telecom GSM licenses to the private sector, and there are two private sector companies operating pay phone services in Egypt.

The revenues from sales of stationed shares in 31 companies from July 2005 – December 2005 reached EGP 10.9bn (USD1.9bn), which is higher than that of the entire fiscal year from July 2004 to June 2005.

Egypt views the private sector as an engine of growth. The government is the facilitator of business success, supporting private enterprise via legislation and its provision of goods and services.

Financial Sector:

Extensive financial restructuring has resulted in mergers such as Banque Misr and Banque du Caire, as well as sales of joint venture banks such as Egyptian American Bank and Cairo Far East Bank; these will be followed by the Bank of Alexandria.

In addition to these measures a Bank restructuring unit at CBE, raised the minimum capital requirement from EGP 100mn to EGP500mn, and significant steps have been taken toward the resolution of NPL's (Non performing Loans) from public and private enterprise.

As part of the government commitment to reform, bankers with private sector experience have been appointed to head Egypt's biggest state banks. In addition guidelines have been laid down for the structure and objectives of audit committees in all licensed banks.

The Public sector:

The government's new system of taxes enshrines the principles of trust and self assessment. The first budget to be presented under the current GFS – the 2005/06 Budget reflected this with substantial tax reductions, corporations can now benefit from lower and unified taxes and the top rate of income tax slashed in half. It is anticipated that the cost of these tax cuts will be compensated for by an increase of economic activity as a result of the reductions themselves.

Customs reforms and tariff reductions:

In order to meet the challenges of a global market customs procedures have been greatly simplified. On 6,500 items the weighted average tariff rate was reduced from 14.6 to 9%. The number of tariff bands was cut from 27 to 6, and all imports customs service fees were cancelled, they had previously stood at between 1% and 4%.

These tax cuts will create losses which the government will redress with a marked rise in domestic Gas and Diesel prices.

Exchange Rate System:

Policymakers introduced interbank market for foreign exchange and removed surrender requirements.

Egypt is Luxor and Aswan

A new tomb has just been discovered in Luxor's Valley of the Kings, as if one needed further incentive to visit this myriad of temples, monuments and tombs. It is not without justification that these two ancient cities are considered the heart of Egyptology.

Egypt is the Bibliotheca of Alexandria

The city of Alexandria, with its Greco-Roman Antiquities and Mediterranean flavor is home to this vast complex of culture and scientific excellence.

Egypt is Dr Mohamed ElBaradei

Egypt is proud of the work that Dr. ElBaradei – Director General of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) is doing. In October 2005 the world recognized Dr. ElBaradei when he and the IAEA were jointly awarded the Nobel Peace Prize for efforts 'to prevent Nuclear energy being used for military purposes and to ensure that nuclear energy for peaceful purposes is used in the safest possible way.'





Egypt's Trade Agreements

Egypt is Ahmed H. Zewail

Ahmed Zewail is an Egyptian American chemist; he has won many international awards culminating in his 1999 Nobel Prize in Chemistry, for his work in femtochemistry.

Egypt is Naguib Mahfouz

Naguib Mahfouz is an Egyptian novelist, generally regarded as the creator of the modern Arabic novel, also author of many short stories and film scripts; he was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1988.



Egypt-EU Association Agreement:

Lifts all barriers to non-agricultural trade with Europe over the coming decade.

Egypt signs QIZ protocol with Israel:

In December 2004, Egypt in a renewed commitment to free trade, foreign investment and regional economic cooperation, signed a QIZ protocol with both Israel and the United States. This is seen as a step towards the signing of a free trade agreement (FTA) with the United States.

World Trade Organization:

Egypt has been active member of the WTO since the 1970s and is actively engaged in the Doha Round discussions.

Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA)

A free and preferential trade agreement establishing a free trade between member states.

Agadir Declaration

Establishes free trade with Jordan, Morocco and Tunisia

Greater Arab Free Trade Area (GAFTA)

Links Egypt with 17 Arab Nations in a single free trade zone

H.E Ms. Fayza Abou El Naga
Minister of International Cooperation

H.E Abou El Naga has played a prominent role as Egypt's national coordinator in the field of international cooperation since her appointment as the first female Minister of State for Foreign Affairs in November 2001.

Her constant hard work on enhancing bilateral and multilateral economic and international relations was crowned by the setting up of the Sector of International Cooperation as a full-fledged Ministry by virtue of Presidential Decree in 2004.

The Minister's main responsibilities include holding negotiations and realizing the implementation of international agreements and protocols in the fields of economic and technical cooperation.

Abou El Naga chairs the National Committee for Demining and Development of the North-Western Coast since 2001. She is a member of a number of ministerial committees concerned with policy formulation, including economic planning, managing foreign debt, investment, employment, and human resources development. She is also a member of the board of governors of the Social Fund for Development (SFD).

Abou El Naga Represented the President of Egypt in several African Summits as well as Summits of the Non Aligned Movement, the Organization of the Islamic Conference, the Group of Fifteen and the World Summit on sustainable Development. She also represented Egypt in several meetings of the World's Economic Forum.

Prior to her appointment as Minister of State for Foreign Affairs, Abou El Naga held the posts of Permanent Representative of Egypt to the United Nations(UN) in Geneva and International Organizations in Switzerland. Abou El Naga held the post of Deputy Assistant Minister of Foreign Affairs for African Bilateral Relations. Abou El Naga was listed as one of the eleven most powerful female leaders in Africa in 2003 in a book by Dr. Sharon T. Freeman.

Abou El Naga graduated from the Faculty of Commerce, Cairo University, and started her eminent career in 1973 by joining the diplomatic service.


